Treasurers Report

A key challenge our club faces every year is the raising of enough funds to maintain the high level of water development for our juniors, whilst also catering for the "not so junior" club members. The club was able to retain the support of all of its major sponsors MOZO, PJ Gallagher's, EG Funds Management, Datapharm, Renascent and Australian Structural Steel. In addition, the club is grateful to have a new sponsor, Birkenhead Point who are generously supporting our Junior Development Program. National League Cap Sponsors however have been harder to secure resulting in the combined sponsorship income falling by \$9,250 in the year compared with the prior year.

Fundraising also had its ups and downs. Our August Life Members lunch contributed a tidy profit of \$12,000 and the revamped Parliament House Luncheon was again well supported by the water polo community delivering a profit of approx. \$50,000. These results were both in line with budget. On the

downside, the swimathon result was below budget and the “Girls night in” event did not happen, nor did the Trade Directory.

Two other functions of the club namely, the junior development clinics and merchandise sales, whilst not designed to be big profit spinners, certainly flourished under renewed dedication from club members. I’d like to acknowledge the hard work of Paul & Joanne Steen, Andrew Murray and Fraser Foristal with the JDP and Lynn Hahn and Michelle Holden with merchandise sales.

Operating expenses have largely been within budget with the following exceptions. Pool hire costs have increased by \$18,700 from last year, but this has been mostly offset by pool entry fees collected of \$12,300. The increase in costs is a result of additional pool usage at Riverview College and Sydney Olympic park. Rental costs also grew by \$10,900 and this was due to the club renting larger premises to house National league imports. These two areas need to have a high focus in the coming year with a breakeven objective so as not to be a drain on future resources.

So to sum up, the net result for the year was a profit of \$2,510 which compares with a loss for the prior year of \$9,305. For next year the “Red Ball” will replace the February Luncheon as the main fund raiser. However, the Red Ball will unlikely generate the same profit, therefore the treasurer’s role will need additional resources in the following focus areas in order for the club to maintain a profitable position:

- Fee collection
- Pool entry fees and cost control
- National League revenue and cost control.
